Yet when Jesus appears for the second time and Thomas is present, it was simply the presence of the Risen Lord that transforms Thomas, just being present with Jesus.

Thomas doesn't have to put his finger in the wounds. Simply the presence of Jesus, His words, His touch, His compassion, and His grace, transforms a doubter into a believer.

May we all experience that type of transformation experience with Jesus during the Easter season.
